MEET OUR SPEAKERS

<u>Doug Cunningham</u> - Doug is currently Head of Science at the Bruce Peninsula and District School in Lion's Head, Ontario. An enthusiastic amateur astronomer for 14 years, Doug's astronomy interests include grazing occultations, cataclysmic variable stars, deep sky objects and double stars. A teacher for 15 years, Doug greatly enjoys working with his students. Many enjoyable nights have been spent under the stars with interested and inquiring young people. These efforts have resulted in many student astronomy projects. Everything from modeling eclipsing binary stars, through radio astronomy to colour analysis of the crab nebula.

<u>Steve Dodson</u> - Steve is the Program Planner for the Physical Science section of Science North, the Sudbury Science Centre. He became interested in astronomy at the age of 7 and educated himself by reading astronomy books and magazines. In 1981, Steve built a 22" trailer mounted Dobsonian telescope. This telescope won second prize for mechanical design at Stellafane in 1981. In 1982, Steve joined the staff of Science North as the Physical Science Planner. One of his responsibilities is the astronomy display which focuses on the sun. You will be able to listen to the sun as you analyse it's spectrum or study the surface in white or H-alpha light.

<u>Andreas Gada</u> - Andreas has been an active observer since high school. His main interests are graze observing, astrophotography, and eclipse chasing. This latter interest lead to a trip to Indonesia to view and photograph the June 11, 1983 Total Solar Eclipse. Andreas will be presenting slides of this eclipse and of the Southern Skies.

<u>Barry Sherman</u> - Barry has been an active observer for 20 years. In the last two years, he has become highly involved in astrophotography. His photographs have been published in ORBIT and ASTROTENT. Barry will be describing the techniques he uses to obtain good quality astrophotograhs with a C8.

<u>Michael Taylor</u> - Michael is a Professor of Design and Photography at the University of Guelph. His interest in designing and constructing large and small optical instruments has resulted in the construction of a highly portable 15" fork-mounted telescope and a unique remote camera. Since the early seventies, Michael, as a guest of NASA, has attended and photographed the launch of most of the manned and unmanned space vehicles. Michael will be describing the equipment and method he uses to obtain high resolution photographs of NASA space launches.

INFORMAL PRESENTATIONS

Informal slide presentations will be held in the recreation hail after the morning and afternoon Feature Slide Presentations. If you wish to present a short talk on your observing activities, please submit a brief description of your planned presentation with your registration form. These presentations are limited to 15 minutes speaking time.


